

PUBLIC NOTICE

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CERTIFICATE OF ENVIRONMENTAL COMPATIBILITY AND PUBLIC NEED FOR ELECTRIC TRANSMISSION LINE BETWEEN NORTHPORT, NEW YORK AND NORWALK, CONNECTICUT

GENERAL INFORMATION

In accordance with Article VII of the New York Public Service Law, the Long Island Power Authority ("LIPA") is providing public notice of its intent to file an application for an amendment to its Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need ("Certificate") issued in New York Public Service Commission Case 01-T-1679. The Certificate was issued to LIPA on June 21, 2007 to build a 138 kV submarine electric transmission line between Northport, New York and Norwalk Connecticut ("Facility").

DESCRIPTION AND LOCATION OF FACILITY

The Facility consists of approximately 11 miles of three 138 kV electric transmission cables installed beneath the bed of the Long Island Sound between LIPA's substation in the Town of Huntington on the Northport Power Station property and a Connecticut Light & Power Substation in Norwalk, Connecticut. The Facility, which replaces the existing liquid-insulated cables between the same two points, will have the same nominally-rated transfer capability of 300 MW with two of the three cables in service. The only above ground portion of the Facility will be within the boundaries of the LIPA's existing substation.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CERTIFICATE

In its application for an amendment to the Certificate, LIPA will request that the New York Public Service Commission authorize it to use dredging to remove a section of the existing cables that it has been unable to remove from the seabed using the procedures authorized in the Certificate and/or to drain, cut and leave in place the section of the cables that cannot be removed.

DATE OF THE FILING

LIPA expects to file the application for an amendment to its Certificate with the Public Service Commission on or about March 3, 2008. At the time of filing a copy of the filing will be provided to each executive officer of each municipality in which any portion of the proposed and alternative facility is to be located.
