LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION UPDATE

- The Legislative Commission on the Future of LIPA held four more public hearings this month in Suffolk County, Nassau County, the Rockaways, and Southampton
- LIPA was invited to provide testimony at the hearings
- PSEG Long Island management contract expires December 31, 2025

• Next Steps:

- A final report and draft legislation will be issued by the Commission by the end of November 2023
- The Legislature and Governor will determine whether to move forward with the legislation in the next Legislative session
- LIPA will move forward with the competitive bidding process for the next management contract(s) early next year unless the Legislature and Governor decide to implement changes to LIPA's business model

2023 PLAN OF FINANCE UPDATE

2023 INTEGRATED RESOURCE PLAN

LIPA's Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) will be released for public comment in October

- Issued every five years, the current IRP has a study period of 2023 to 2040 and discusses actions and decisions that need to occur between now and 2030 to meet the state's clean energy goals as we transition to a carbon-free grid
- The IRP looks at questions such as:
 - How will LIPA integrate substantial amounts of renewable generation and battery storage into the electric grid?
 - What significant investments are needed in the transmission grid serving Long Island and the Rockaways?
 - How is LIPA phasing out fossil-fueled generation? How can we use clean electricity to decarbonize heating and transportation?
 - How will disadvantaged communities and low-and moderate-income customers be affected?
- Any actions beyond 2030 will be considered in the next IRP and based on what has changed between reports





2024 BUDGET AND PERFORMANCE METRICS

- LIPA is preparing to present the proposed 2024 Operating and Capital Budgets and Performance Metrics at the November 15 Board meeting, with the Board considering the plans at the December 13 meeting
- LIPA provided its initial 2024 Metrics proposals to PSEG Long Island in two waves in mid-June and late July
- LIPA's Metric proposals are aligned with the strategic direction provided by the Board in its <u>policies</u> and with the <u>5-Year Strategic Plan</u>
- PSEG Long Island submitted to LIPA its proposed 2024 Operating and Capital Budget in late July
- LIPA and PSEG Long Island will submit their respective 2024 Metric proposals to DPS for their review and recommendation to the LIPA Board on or about October 3
- Public comment hearings are planned for on or about November 27
