Re: *Matter 14-01299 - PSEG Long Island Utility 2.0 Long Range Plan*

Dear Mr. Rhodes and Secretary Phillips:

In accordance with New York State Public Authorities Law § 1020-f(ee) and the Second Amended and Restated Operations Services Agreement between Long Island Lighting Company d/b/a LIPA and PSEG Long Island LLC, PSEG Long Island hereby submits its updated Utility 2.0 Long Range Plan (“Utility 2.0 Plan” or the “Plan”). The Plan provides PSEG Long Island’s 2025 annual update to the Utility 2.0 Plan related programs for which PSEG Long Island seeks: 1) a positive recommendation from the New York State Department of Public Service (“DPS”) pursuant to New York State Public Service Law § 3-b(3)(a) and (g); and 2) incremental funding approval from the Long Island Power Authority (the “Authority”). Based on previous recommendations from DPS Staff, the Plan also includes PSEG Long Island’s proposed Building Efficiency and Electrification Plan (“BEE Plan”).


As the Authority’s service provider, PSEG Long Island is committed to helping transform the energy system in New York, decarbonize the economy and support disadvantaged communities, which are priorities identified in the New York State Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act. As discussed in greater detail in the Plan, PSEG Long Island’s building efficiency and electrification plans make a wide selection of incentives, rebates, and programs available to residential and commercial customers on Long Island and the Rockaways to assist them in reducing their energy usage, thereby lowering their energy bills. In May 2025, the Public Service Commission Orders Authorizing Low-to-Moderate (“LMI”) and Non-LMI Energy Efficiency and Building Electrification Portfolios for 2026 through 2030 were issued.¹ PSEG Long Island has begun aligning its programs to

these orders through efforts detailed in the BEE Plan, such as expanding strategic measures like heat pumps and weatherization through 2026.
